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A NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ...

The Northville Community Foundation (NCF) has served the Northville Community for 22 years and is focused on growing and enriching education, primarily through the operation of Maybury Farm. The mission of NCF and Maybury Farm is to educate children and families in the surrounding communities about the animals and agriculture that are essential to a working farm in Michigan, historically and today, through hands-on experiences that are engaging, informative and fun.

NCF and Maybury Farm had another great year thanks to all our employees, volunteers, and most importantly the community, who continue to support and help us reach our goals and exceed them. In 2019, we had record attendance at Maybury Farm events, we worked hard on enhancements to the grounds, completed the installation of one and half miles of new fencing, and improved our educational programming at the farm.

Our biggest project in 2019 was the installation of new pasture fencing along with the addition of an arena. With the installation of the fence we were able to make better use of our pasture land, and open up more of that space to the farms visitors so they can see the animals no matter where they are located. These new pastures allow our educators to get the children closer to the animals, while the new arena provides space for demonstrations with the animals that we did not have before. This better use of space will allow us to continue to improve and grow our educational offering at the farm as well as the overall farm experience when you come to visit.

We held our annual Holiday Home Tour fundraiser, that not only supports Maybury Farm but also provides grants to other non-profit organizations and community programs. To see a list of the grants awarded for 2019 see page 6.

We have made tremendous progress over the last two years and as we continue to focus our efforts within the community, we recognize that we could not be successful without YOU! 



2019 YEAR IN REVIEW



June – we hosted 6 classes from Northville and Detroit schools for a Farm Animals & Us Tour and a service project packing food with Kids Against Hunger. This is the second year in a row that Maybury Farm has been selected as the host site for this event.



July – we once again hosted New Hope Center for Grief Support's, Grief Camp. This 2-day camp provides time for children ages 5-14 to meet others who have experienced a loss and to learn positive coping skills from the animals at the farm. We truly value our partnership with New Hope and the service they provide to the community.

September - we celebrated the completion of the new outdoor arena and installation of 1.5 miles of new fencing. The new fencing provides safe, secure spaces for our animals and provides us with the ability to better utilize our pastures for education allowing our guests to better observe the animals in a more natural setting. The addition of the arena allows us to provide education at a safe distance with all of our animals.



Staying true to the Farms mission of educating those in the surrounding community about animals and agriculture, 6,400 kids participated in educational programming at the farm, a 29% increase over the previous year!

2019 YEAR IN REVIEW



Throughout the year -we provided educator led farm tours. This year 6,400 kids participated in tours with their schools, organizations, clubs or summer camps. Whether it was learning how sap becomes syrup, the important role honeybees play in pollination, or where our food and fiber comes from, each child participated in hands-on learning about the world around them.

June through September 1,700 kids participated in our Story Time program. Again, this year we offered a twice-weekly Story Time for kids. Each week children learned about a unique farm topic through stories, songs and sensory play, and sometimes a special animal guest even dropped by! Following Story Time, we offered wagon rides through our fields and forests. In the Fall we added one of our farm educators to each wagon ride to speak to our guests about what they were seeing along the way. Just another way we found to educate our visitors about agriculture and farming.



Again, this year our 3-day Farm Camp was a sell-out! 185 kids registered for Farm Camp which runs weekly from June through August. Our farm camp is held entirely outdoors and provides each camper with the chance to get their hands dirty helping in the garden and with daily chores on the farm. All the while cultivating an awareness and appreciation for the role of farmers, land and animals and how each contributes to our daily lives.



Due to the popularity of our Summer Watch-Me-Grow preschool program for those ages 2-5 a Fall program was added this year with 300 preschoolers participating in total! Each session featured a new topic and was filled with hands-on experiences, music, crafts and games to create an engaging time of fun and learning.



2019 FARM BABIES



Ten babies

were born at the farm this year. Those babies along with the 20 chicks and 6 ducklings we acquired helped us to educate children about lifecycles and the roles of animals on the farm and in our food and fiber systems.
